


## First up project

Trim boards get two coats of brown paint




Drilling jig clamped in place for Kreg pocket screws.

Connie is sponging in primer for first coat





Measure and cut new wood for facia




Prep and paint new wood



Wood run thru plainer and sloted on table saw.




Woiod fitted into frame.


Screw holes drilled and shamford in frame for 3" deck screws.




## Window frame cut




Dave finishes window opening, Door ready to install and finalize
